- 1. **OWNER IS THE EXHIBITOR**. All entries must be made as the papers read. No signed transfers. Exhibitor must have ownership by July 1 of the current year. Limit of 30 head per farm or address.
 - a. All goats must be identified by registered breed tattoo accompanied by breed registration papers.
 - b. Tampering and/or misrepresentation as to breeding, ownership and any other irregularity in showing will be considered fraud and deception. Any premiums, trophies or awards won by such exhibitor will be withheld.

- All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374, by August 1, 2023. There is a mandatory \$5.00 processing fee for all mail in entries. LATE ENTRIES: Entries received between August 2, 2023, and August 7, 2023, will incur a \$50.00 Late Entry Fee.
 - a. Entries must be made on proper entry forms. Youth exhibitors must complete Youth section of entry form and submit all Youth fees.

 Animals must be in Youth's (the exhibitor) name. Youth's name must be printed on the registration papers. Youth exhibitors entering

 Open classes must complete Open section and pay open fees. Registration papers should be presented at time of check in.
 - b. Exhibitor form and Current W-9 (W-8 Canadian) must be filled out and returned. Entries must include fees. (this is Social Security Number).

- 4. An exhibitor may show a maximum of two (2) animals per class and one (1) entry per group class. In the Best Udder and Best Home Bred classes an exhibitor may only enter one (1) animal.
- 5. An exhibitor may substitute an animal within the same class as entered at no charge. The exhibitor will be charged a fee of \$500 to substitute an animal into a different class.
- 6. The base date for computing the age of goats shall be the day the animal is judged.
- 7. A goat with a contagious disease will not be allowed to pen or show.
- 8. Open & Youth All breeds, all does 2 years of age and older must have freshened.
- 9. A youth exhibitor must be seven (7) years of age, but not over twenty (20) years of age as of January 1 of the current year to participate in any youth animal class. For classes under the Youth Educational or Demonstration categories exhibitors are limited to youth who are seven (7) years of age but not over twenty (20) years of age as of January 1 of current year. Date of birth must be on entry form. Open exhibitors must be seven (7) years of age unless otherwise stated.
 - a. Each youth exhibitor will be permitted to enter a maximum of ten (10) goats and show a maximum of two (2) per class, except in championships.
 - b. Animals entered in a youth's name in the youth show must also be entered in that youth's name in the open show, if the youth should choose to show in the Open show.
 - c. Youth exhibitors in this department are expected to observe the following dress regulations for showing Dairy breeds White shirt or blouse with white, black or khaki pants or skirts and closed toe shoes or boots. Meat breeds A shirt or blouse and black, blue or khaki pants and closed toe shoes or boots. Shorts are not proper attire and will not be allowed in the show ring.

Aisles will have rolled roofing or other covering on them for movement to and from the rings, etc. ***There will not be carpeting under pens this year***

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

- 2. Only animals exhibited in open individual classes are eligible to show in group classes.
- 3. Junior Champion Class shall consist of all first & second place winners in the first (4) four classes. Senior Champion Class shall consist of all first place winners in the next five classes, or does under 2, in milk and older animals.
- 4. Senior Champion and Junior Champion and Reserve animals shall compete for Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion.
- 5. Challenge Doe Class Permanent Champion Dairy Doe who has received a permanent ADGA Championship. Permanent champions may be shown in the regular or the challenge class, whichever the owner chooses.
