RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SHOW

Youth Exhibitor: K-12th Grade. Youth must be five (5) years of age, but not over twenty (20) years of age as of January 1 of the current year. Date of birth must be on entry form. **Must be from an Urban Area (30K population or higher).** Open to Michigan youth only.

Scholarship Entry Criteria:

- a) Must be from an Urban Area (30K population or higher).
- b) Proof of farming work (letter from parent or other adult who confirms youth exhibitor's involvement).
- c) Pictures of youth exhibitor actively gardening.
- d) Pictures of plans.
- e) Research plans.
- f) One to two page essay.
- g) Harvested items or pictures of items.
- h) Scholarship applicants must have a storyboard display (poster boards) no smaller than 22 x 28 in. and no larger than the tri-fold board at the State Fair.
 - Application without storyboard awards up to \$500.
 - Application with storyboard awards up to \$1,000.
 - Questions about the storyboards should be directed to Tierra Modock via email: tierramodock@gmail.com

Deadline date is August 24th (one week before fair).

The boards must be delivered to the Home Arts / Agriculture and Urban Farming Department, Michigan State Fair between August 28th – August 31st.

1. Agriculture Exhibitor Entry Form and current W-9 form (W-8 Canadian) must be filled out and returned.
2. All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374, by August 1, 2022.
3. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the ***"Michigan State Fair LLC"*** or complete valid credit card information and signature.

4. **CAMPING.** Camping **MUST BE** registered for **SEPERATELY**. Please use this link to apply:

5. **A maximum of 2 entries per class per exhibitor. Exhibitor cannot enter the same item in more than one class.**
6. Exhibits must be grown as a project of the exhibitor. Previously entered items and displays are ineligible.
7. Exhibitors must leave the Agriculture Building during judging.
8. All entries in this department must stay the entire length of the Fair. The superintendent will remove and dispose of any unsightly produce or exhibits considered to be unworthy of exhibition by the judge.
9. **RIBBONS AWARDED TO THIRD PLACE.** Only current Michigan State Fair LLC Ribbons may be displayed with exhibits. All others will be removed.
10. Exhibits cannot be sold in the Agriculture Building.
