## **Judging Schedule:**

Tuesday, September 1<sup>st</sup> 1:00 p.m. Building will be closed until judging is completed.

## **FEES:**

Exhibitor – Open: \$15.00 (required); admits one person. Extra passes are available for \$15.00.

Open Class Entry fees: \$1.00 for each entry.

Youth Entry fees: \$15.00 entry fee for youth, which covers up to ten (10) entries. **Any additional Youth entry over 10: \$1.00 for each additional entry.** Youth: Age for youth are seven (7) through twenty (20) years of age as of January 1 of the current year.

**If Youth is entering BOTH Open and Youth Classes, fees must be paid for both Open and Youth.**

**An entry fee will not be refunded if the entry is cancelled or not exhibited.**

Parking: \$15.00 for weekend (Pass allows access behind the building after Thursday, September 3.)

## **ELIGIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS – Michigan Residents Only**

1. **Open Class.** Seven (7) years of age as of January 1, of the current year.
2. **Youth.** Seven (7) years of age through twenty (20) years of age as of January 1, of the current year. Must be a Michigan youth.
3. Exhibitors must be **non-professional**.
  - An amateur is a person who does not sell for profit on a part- or full-time basis and whose exhibit represents a recreational hobby.
  - A professional is a person engaged in activity for a monetary profit of more than \$2,000 annually as a result of his or her craft and/or cooking skill.

## **Exhibit Rules**

1. Exhibitor: A current W-9 form must be filled out and returned.
2. **All fees must accompany entries.**
3. All entries must be made in accordance with general terms and conditions. Please go to: [www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com](http://www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com) and enter online.  
**LATE ENTRIES: Entries received between August 2, 2026, and August 7, 2026, will incur a \$50.00 Late Entry Fee.**
4. **CAMPING.** Camping **MUST BE** registered for **SEPERATELY**. Please use this link to apply:

5. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and shown in his/her name.
6. Entry tags must be attached to all exhibits. Tags will be available at check-in. **YOU MUST HAVE CLAIM CHECK(S) FOR RELEASE OF EXHIBITS. NO ITEM WILL BE RELEASED WITHOUT EXHIBITOR CLAIM CHECK(S).**
7. Premiums will only be paid on the articles listed. No specials.
8. The management reserves the right to determine whether an article is worthy of exhibition.
9. Judges shall not award prizes to unworthy exhibits, whether there is competition or not.

10. **All articles entered for exhibition must be delivered in person to the Home Arts Department.** Any exceptions need to be approved by the superintendent.
11. To protect your exhibits from the environment, it is recommended you cover your exhibit with clear plastic that can be removed for judging.
12. **Absolutely NO GLASS in FRAMED articles.**
13. While every reasonable precaution will be taken to safeguard all exhibits, it is distinctly understood that in no case shall the Michigan State Fair LLC, its management, officers or agents be held responsible for loss or injury of any character to person or articles while participating in or exhibited at the Fair.
14. **Any exhibit improperly entered will not be judged.**
15. **Only one (1) article may be entered in a class unless otherwise specified.** An exhibitor may not show the same item in both youth and open classes.
16. There is no need to submit a recipe with your item, unless specifically requested.
17. Definition of **Exhibitor**: A person who displays an item and/or items of interest at the Michigan State Fair. **Exhibit**: An item and/or items of interest to be displayed at the Michigan State Fair.

# Michigan State Fair:

## Code of Conduct for Exhibitors, Parents, Family Member(s), and Helpers

The management of the Michigan State Fair (MSF) is committed to providing a safe and respectful show environment and experience that respects the rights of each and every attendee. All exhibitors, parents and other spectators are expected to exhibit outstanding sportsmanship as well as abide by the standards of the Code of Conduct.

### Policies for Human Conduct:

The MSF Code of Conduct requires attendees to refrain from the following:

- Behavior that is unruly, disruptive, or illegal in nature
- Direct interference or criticism with the show management and officials, judge, other exhibitors, or breed representatives before, during, or after the competitive event
- Intoxication or other signs of alcohol or substance impairment resulting in poor behavior
- Foul, obscene, threatening, offensive or abusive language, gestures or actions
- Interfering with the progress of the show
- Failing to follow the instructions of the show personnel
- Fighting or physical violence of any type
- Conduct that endangers any person
- Knowingly providing false or inaccurate exhibitor or animal information

### Policies for Animal Treatment:

The MSF Code of Conduct requires that animals are not subjected or show signs to any of the following:

- Artificially changing the conformation or appearance by treating the animal, internally or externally, with any irritant, counter irritant, or any other substance
- Adding false hair, wool, or any other similar substance to any part of the animal unless it is allowed by equine and dairy standards
- Forced administration of fluids or substance to the animal that is not considered part of an accepted and normal livestock diet
- Administration of quantities of fluid, feed, or any other substance that is not considered normal
- Use of tranquilizers, sedatives, or depressants which alter the physical or behavioral state of the animal
- Improper care, feed, water, and husbandry of the animal
- Any animal that appears ill, unhealthy or shows any signs of communicable disease/s must be removed from the premises
- Any animal that is unmanageable or poses a safety hazard must be removed from the premises.
- Physical abuse of an animal

Violators of this code of conduct, as well as their immediate family members and other helpers, will be subject to disciplinary action including but not limited to cancellations of all premiums and awards as well as suspension from current and future MSF events. The MSF management reserves its Show Committee and superintendents the final and absolute right to interpret these

Rules and Regulations and settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard to, or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the MSF.
