Exhibitor: \$15.00 (required) admits one person. Extra passes are available for \$15.00.

Parking: \$15.00 per week (Pass allows access behind the building after Thursday, August 29.)

Per Head: \$7.50 (open classes only)

**YOUTH pays exhibitor fee \$15.00 only.**

If a youth enters in the open classes – open fee and per head fee apply.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SHOW – OPEN & YOUTH**

**\*\*\* Please check and follow General Agriculture & Livestock Rules \*\*\***

1. Exhibitor form, Animal Entry form and Current W-9 (or Canadian) must be filled out and returned. **Entries must include fees.**  
**OWNER IS THE EXHIBITOR. Exhibitors name must match the name on registration papers.** Animals owned in partnership or syndicate may be shown in the name of the partnership or syndicate only.
2. **The floor in the livestock area is polished concrete. For the safety of the animals and exhibitors, exhibitors are responsible for providing suitable floor coverings in their stalls/pens. Examples of coverings may be roofing paper, carpet, plywood, deep bedding, rubber mats or other suitable material to prevent animals from the risk of injury. Aisles will have rolled roofing or other covering on them for movement to and from the rings, etc. \*\*\*THERE WILL NOT BE CARPETING UNDER PENS THIS YEAR\*\*\***
3. All purebred sheep, including lambs, must be registered and it shall be the duty of each exhibitor to present certificates of registration at time of check-in to the superintendent. Transfers must be signed by secretaries of the registry associations and must show the date of transfer. All sheep must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor at the time of making entries. No animals can be shown unless registration papers have been checked and are in order.
4. **MICHIGAN STATE FAIR LLC REQUIRES ALL SHEEP TO HAVE AN OFFICIAL USDA INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION TAG.** Do not remove tags prior to showing. It is illegal to remove official USDA tags. For further information, contact USDA at 866-USDA-TAG (866-873-2824).
5. Entries must be made on proper entry forms. Youth exhibitor's must complete Youth section of entry form and submit all Youth fees. Animals must be in Youth's (the exhibitor) name. Youth exhibitors entering Open classes must complete Open section and pay all open fees.
6. Do not make entries in Champion Classes. Only first prize winner to be eligible for championship prizes, but second prize animals may compete for Reserve Championships. Competition is open to all exhibitors except where classes specify otherwise.
7. All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: [www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com](http://www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com) and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374, by August 1, 2024. There is a mandatory \$5.00 processing fee for all mail in entries. **LATE ENTRIES: Entries received between August 2, 2024, and August 7, 2024, will incur a \$50.00 Late Entry Fee.**
8. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the **“Michigan State Fair LLC”** or complete valid credit card information and signature.
9. **CAMPING.** Camping **MUST BE** registered for **SEPARATELY.**

10. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the **“Michigan State Fair LLC”** or complete valid credit card information and signature.
11. An animal may only be shown in one Section. (i.e., a sheep may not show as a Hampshire and a Commercial) in Open and Youth.
12. An exhibitor may not receive more than one award in group classes and not more than two in any individual class. When there is just one exhibit in a class only one premium will be awarded according to the merit of the animal. No exhibitor will be permitted to enter more than fourteen (14) animals in any one breed, and not more than two (2) animals in any single class. All sheep in group classes must be shown in individual classes.
13. An exhibitor may substitute an animal within the same class as entered at no charge. The exhibitor will be charged a fee of \$5.00 to substitute an animal into a different class.

14. Youth exhibitors will be permitted to enter up to two (2) breeds in this department and a maximum of ten (10) head total in the breeding classes. Youth Division is open to Michigan Youth Only.
15. Youth Exhibitors that will be competing in the junior division of the show must show their own animal unless species chairpersons grant special permission. In the event that a substitute showperson is approved, the substitute showperson must be a registered junior exhibitor in this show. Proper identification of junior exhibitor may be required, at the discretion of the show committee.
16. **Youth may not enter an animal in the same class for in-person and 4-H virtual show. (Example: if a youth enters a Dorset Junior Ewe in the in-person show, they may not enter a Dorset Junior Ewe in the 4-H Virtual Show).**
17. The Michigan State Fair LLC prohibits the use of muzzles.
18. **All chores to be completed by 9 am including feeding, watering and pen cleaning. Aisles are to be clean and swept entire time fair is open to the public.**
19. Water must be available in pens at all times.
20. Humane handling practices of sheep at all times.
21. Tampering and/or misrepresentation as to breeding, age, ownership and any other irregularity in showing will be considered fraud and deception. Any premiums, trophies, and awards won by such exhibitor will be withheld. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
  - a. The addition of any wool or wool-like substance.
  - b. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal.
  - c. The injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation.
  - d. Any attempts to disrupt or change the normal dental development of the animal.
  - e. Any products administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal (such as steroids and growth stimulants) are prohibited.
22. The American Shropshire Registry Association's Board of Directors has approved the decision to exhibit Shropshire sheep slick shorn.

**\*\*\*Making Entries for the Michigan State Fair indicates acceptance of the Michigan State Fair Code of Conduct, which is found in the General Rules.\*\*\***

**EXPLANATION OF TERMS**

1. Flock – Open Show entries shall consist of five (5) head: one ram (any age), two yearling ewes one year old and two ewe lambs.
2. Flock – Youth Show entries shall consist of four (4) head: one ram (any age), two yearling ewes and one ewe lamb; or one ram (any age), one yearling ewe and two ewe lambs.
3. Ages for all lambs will be as follows: Senior, September 1 to December 31; January; and February; March.
4. The base date for computing age will be September 1 and lambs born after that date may be shown as lambs if they have all lamb teeth.
5. Colored sheep are those sheep that are registered with a Natural Association and have at least 70% colored wool, other than white.
6. A Premier Exhibitor shall be an exhibitor who makes the best display with at least six animals, shown in at least three of the single classes with both sexes represented. Animals must be owned and shown by the exhibitor. The point system for determining Premier Exhibitor is as follows:
