It has been an extraordinary journey these past six years, as a dedicated consortium of volunteers, corporate partners, vendors and exhibitors, elected officials and just plain ol' big fans of the Michigan State Fair have banded together to rebuild and reimagine this grand Michigan tradition. In August 2018, we celebrate the 6th Anniversary of the Michigan State Fair, LLC, Thursday, August 30 through Monday September 3, presented by Ram Trucks! It's a great time to pause, reflect and appreciate all those who have contributed to our progress to date—and take a peek over the horizon at the future of the Michigan State Fair and the Suburban Collection Showplace facility and fairgrounds, now undergoing a tremendous expansion...

In 2017, The Michigan State Fair returned more than \$552,000 in charitable contributions to a wide spectrum of community organizations. Urban and Rural Agriculture Scholarship awards now exceed \$40,000 per year, with a total of 51 recipients in 2017—the 2018 scholarship program is being made possible through the generous support of State Fair partners C.F. Burger Creamery, the Detroit Shriners, Kroger of Michigan, MSU College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, ITC Holdings, and Guernsey Farms Dairy. The State Fair focus on youth programs has also grown to include an Agriculture Ambassador Program, funded by Flagstar Bank, a Junior Fair Council advisory board, funded by ITC, comprised of past scholarship recipients --- and also continues to foster literacy with 500 free children's books given away to Fair attendees on Thursday August 30.

Due to the singular faith and determination of all those involved, the positive growth trajectory of the Michigan State Fair, LLC has been nothing less than dramatic over these past several years. The Suburban Collection Showplace facility is now under construction, adding 180,000+ square feet of new event space. The property footprint of the Fairgrounds at the Suburban Collection Showplace has expanded by 43 new acres, acquired since 2013, allowing the addition of new equestrian arenas, barns and the return of horse shows, continued expansion of the Shrine Circus infrastructure and Arnold Amusement Midway, and boasting more than 50 exciting rides--entertainment stages, and also the addition of the Ram Truck test drive experience track. Many folks now exclaim over the eye-popping expanse as they drive by on I-96!

Inside the Suburban Collection Showplace, Livestock Exhibitor participation continues to astonish us all with its growth, year over year...there is tremendous interest in the Michigan State Fair, LLC, from breeders across the Midwest, as word travels about the clean facilities, pleasant atmosphere and terrific amenities the Suburban Collection Showplace, Hyatt Place Hotel and Novi community offer to participants. The positive feedback from exhibitors is heartfelt --- and deeply appreciated by all who work hard to welcome the show animals and their handlers. Home Arts and Agriculture competitions and

Backing up her original songwriting with amazing performances for years has earned Carolyn national and international respect. She is highly regarded on the Michigan Music scene, and has been honored by the Detroit Music Awards as Outstanding Rock/Pop Songwriter in 2015 & 2016, Outstanding Acoustic/Americana Album in 2014, Outstanding Rock/Pop Album in 2010 and more.

**Laura Rain and the Caesars** transform funky Soul and R&B into something fresh and unexpected with their own unique vision. Inspired by the spirit of classic recordings of a bygone era, Laura Rain creates her own environment of expression with a powerful and soulful voice. The band was formed in the Motor City in 2012, with her husband **George Friend**, and the pair set off on a creative journey, writing and recording their own music. The two garnered many accolades from music press and radio with their debut release "Electrified" in 2013. Performing with a stripped down lineup of organ, guitar and drums, the band developed it's signature sound, and cultivated a vintage toned energetic foundation.

Beginning in 2014, the band began touring heavily within the U.S. and Canada. Starting in Chicago with regular appearances at the House of Blues and Buddy Guy's Legends, Laura Rain has stunned audiences with her intensity and powerful voice. Performing in over 25 states from California to New York, the band has delighted audiences with their dynamic performances. Featured at the Mississippi Valley Blues Festival, Marquette Area Blues Festival, Edmonton Blues Festival, the Legendary Blues Cruise and many other top tier clubs and festivals, Laura Rain and the Caesars continue to grow making new friends and fans along the way.

Brandon Calhoon, a native son of Beaverton, MI, came to early fame as a finalist on the hit CBS reality TV show Rock Star: INXS in 2005. Since then, his career trajectory has expanded to embrace both the Rock and Country music genres, with several popular releases recorded in Detroit, northern Michigan and Nashville, and further forays into providing soundtracks for several television series (Battle Creek, Justified, Backcountry Quest) as well as commercial campaigns for Chevrolet, the MLB Network and Red Bull International. His 2010 song, Detroit City, became a local pride anthem of sorts, and he has since attracted multiple nominations from the Detroit Music Awards for Outstanding Rock Vocalist. Brandon spent much of 2017 in Nashville, writing and recording his most recent release, Let It Ride, with Grammy Award winning writer/producer Jim "Moose" Brown. Brandon will be performing across the U.S this fall with experiential marketing firm EEI of Rochester Hills, representing Ram Trucks at select Harvest celebration events.

The Gasoline Gypsies, of Port Huron, serve up rollicking, genre-transcending Blue Water Michigan Rock & Roll, delivered by four guys who clearly love their craft. With three part vocal harmonies, driving guitar and bass riffs, the songs are powerful and intense, yet simple and pure. The Gypsies are soon to release their most recent effort, "Vagabundos!" following a year full of accolades including being deemed one of the "Three Best Unsigned Bands in the USA" by JBL, 2018 WDIV Local 4 Best Original Rock Band in Metro Detroit, and Grand Prize Winners of the 2017 Michigan State Fair Superstar contest. The Gypsies also recently took home two Detroit Music Awards for Outstanding Americana Group and for Outstanding Americana Recording, for their 2017 release, Killin' Time.

The first incarnation of the Gasoline Gypsies was an acoustic, three-piece Folk/Rock act, featuring founding members Caleb Malooley and Steve Briere, a trio that crystalized the Gypsies love for crisp harmonies and mature themes. The departure of their percussion man for Nashville resulted in meeting drummer Joe Makowski, an unabashed rock and roller whose powerful style begged that the Gypsies plug right in, and test their Rock chops! Electrified, Caleb's front man guitar skills blossomed. Their evolution eventually led to the addition of guitarist Neal Love, who adds another invaluable layer of mystery and magic to The Gasoline Gypsies. This is a band that reverently respects the art of the music, and celebrates the rich legacy of Detroit flavored, Jam-based Rock & Roll. The Gypsies new EP, Vagabundos, celebrates their free spirited, open road ethic, and lays the foundation for their exciting new Gypsy fan tribe network, a creative, collaborative approach to engaging their followers in the fun of their journey, navigating life, and traversing the music business landscape of today.

Ideeyah: Defining her style as a funky creation influenced by electronic, soul and funk, you can find Ideeyah zoning out to a plethora of genres from Alice Coltrane to Zap Mama. Her on-stage presence captures attention and easily turns spectators into believers as she exudes an aura of love from her microphone into the amplifiers. Ideeyah's craft has garnered her mass appeal from her peers in the music world summoned upon to open up for/ perform alongside the likes of Jessica Care Moore, Monica Blaire, Joi, Erykah Badu, Nona Hendryx, Norma Jean Bell (Prince), Divinity Roxx (Beyoncé), Waajeed (Platinum Pied Pipers), Theo Parrish, Talib Kweli, Malcolm-Jamal Warner, Dwele, Zo!, and Amp Fiddler. She is currently touring with her debut solo album, *BRAVE*.

Al Bettis proves that it's never too late to follow your passion. Inspired at age 30, this self-taught singer-songwriter learned to play guitar and compose music. Al blends sounds of folk, jazz, and soul in a way that defies any one genre. Quickly attracting attention and making an impact, his debut single "It Is Beautiful" reached local top 10 countdowns in 2014. Gaining even more accolades for his live performances, he achieved the runner-up spot in the 2017 Michigan State Fair Superstar competition. Al Bettis recently released his new single "The One That Got Away" and is currently working on a new EP titled *Hard Love*.

**Nique Love Rhodes** is a hip-hop artist/performer, record producer, social entrepreneur, and community advocate from Detroit, Michigan with the mission to set souls on fire and contribute positive vibes in the world one song at a time. Inspired by artists such as Bob Marley and U2, Nique Love Rhodes creates music that elevates positive vibrations within the universal collective conscience, promotes social consciousness and social responsibility, and inspires people to affect positive change in the world.

With her self-released debut album, **Against All Odds**, Nique infuses her songs with messages of hope, unity, spirituality, and calls to action for social change as seen in songs such as "Love Heals All" and "Rise Up," which was licensed for use by the **NFL Network** and the **Detroit Lions**. In 2013, Nique was nominated for two Detroit Music Awards. Since this time, she has performed at many major festivals and headlined venues including the North by Northeast Music Festival (Toronto), African World Fest (Detroit), the Nuyorican Poets Café (New York City), and the South by Southwest Music Festival (Texas).

Her music is galvanized by her bold, energetic, and empowering live show. Backed by her band The NLR Experience, her interactive shows fuse hip-hop music with soul, rock, and jazz to create a dynamic live musical experience. This is sonically captured in the band's most recent project, a live album titled the NLR Experience, which is currently available on all streaming platforms.

**The Brothers Groove** are perhaps most conveniently described as a jazz funk trio with bluesy, soulful vocals. Their music exudes a sly, savvy funkiness sprinkled with unique characters, harmonies, and ideas. **Chris Codish** (keyboard/vocals) has penned colorful songs that he paints in smoky hues with his intimate baritone while **James Simonson** (bass) and **Skeeto Valdez** (drums) lay down a rock solid pocket underneath (both are also explosive, dynamic soloists in their own right).

While there's nothing the Brothers like better than to "put it in the pocket" they hold in reserve the musical chops to "push it into the red" and love to jam with each other or any of their many "All-Star" musical friends who might chance to drop by. However far out these improvisational flights might go, they never lose that solid dance groove and they never forget that that jazz was, and still is, a "dance" music. They've released three CDs ("Clamp It Down" "Layin' In The Cut" and "So Glad you Came") and have individually and collectively won over 40 Detroit Music Awards. In 2003 they were hand picked by Bose to exemplify and demonstrate the use of the new L1 Personal Amplification System. They've been featured on the cover of Metro Times and The Record (Detroit's Music Journal), which asked in a cover story if they were "Detroit's Hippest Band?" Give the Brothers Groove a listen and decide for yourself.

Held in high regard, Detroiter **Wayne Gerard** combines his mastery of the guitar with his love for production and composition to produce the total package.

With numerous recordings and productions under his belt, he has also toured and performed with the likes of Bob James, Stevie Wonder, Angela Bofill, Warren Hill, Marion Meadows, Paul Taylor and many others. He has scored 10 feature length and short films as well as providing music for numerous film trailers and commercials.

**Host/Producer Nadir Omowale** doesn't have time to be satisfied. There is far too much life to be lived. The fourteen-time Detroit Music Award winner and former MTV News correspondent is driven by an impassioned activism. All of his hats – performer, producer, creative strategist – are worn by a man who explores as he produces, teaches as he advises, and creates art that honors the fact that life is filled with extremes and in-betweens. The result is infectious, a creative electricity that is the essence of Nadir.

Nadir will tell you that life is too important not to be an activist! His impressions about life are the essence of his work. His lyrics can tug at heartstrings, tickle funny bones, or evoke an honest look at the world around us, and (possibly more importantly) the world within us.

His music is influenced by funk, but don't call Nadir a funk revivalist. His understanding of rock, R&B, hip hop, and jazz takes funk to a most Nadir-centric next step; a Southern born, and Detroit raised sound that doesn't fit in traditional boxes. His music reaches across genres and political aisles, always challenging listeners with a funk inspired, Motor City sound that is as relevant today, as Holland-Dozier-Holland were in the sixties...When Nadir Omowale performs, you get more than music. You get all of the man, his humor, his passion, and the depth of a personality that embraces his responsibility to make this a better world, because of his love of life.

"To label Nadir as a neo-soul artist would be neglecting his rock roots; to call him a rock artist would be overlooking his hip-hop and jazz influences. Fully encompassing all the talents that Nadir possesses would be comparable to expanding the mathematical term Pi to its last digit."



Their latest project is a an expansive new Chicken Coop which will be located at Oakland Ave Urban farm, 9227 Goodwin St., in Detroit, where the young farmers there will be coached in best poultry-raising practices by experienced Poultry farmers Tom and Allie Purves from Clarkston, along with other members of the youth council advisory board..

The Michigan State Fair, presented by Ram Trucks, has launched a new Agriculture Ambassador youth program, funded by Flagstar Bank, aimed at expanding the reach and influence of its youth pro. 
Giving away Just Want to Be Myself

It moved permanently to its home at the Michigan State Fairgrounds on Woodward Avenue in 1905 and was staged there until 2009, when it was discontinued by a resolution of the state government, due to ongoing budget issues. The Michigan State Fair, LLC is now produced by a private entity, and presented with title sponsor Ram Trucks. ### Opening Soon!! An additional 180,000+ square feet at The Suburban Collection Showplace -

Novi, MI: The Suburban Collection Showplace, 46100 Grand River Ave, Novi, new facility expansion is currently on target to open in time for the Michigan State Fair! The expansion includes a new 90,000 square foot Event Center, which will be contiguous to the existing 215,000 square feet of exposition space. A unique and exciting feature of the new Event Center is the 70,000 square feet of column free Event Hall that has 40 foot clear ceiling height that will allow the carnival rides to expand into the interior space during the Michigan State Fair. The **Suburban Collection Showplace** opened at its current location at 46100 Grand River in Novi in 2005 as the Rock Financial Showplace. It is owned and operated by proprietor Blair Bowman. The Suburban Collection Showplace is widely recognized as one of the most successful privately owned convention and exposition center in the U.S.A. The business formerly operated as the Novi Expo Center, in a repurposed manufacturing facility located at Interstate I-96 and Novi Road. The Novi Expo Center formally opened for business in 1992. In 2005, the Showplace operations were relocated to the new facility between Beck and Taft Roads and opened under a naming rights arrangement with Rock Financial.

After Rock Financial had transitioned to Quicken Loans, a new agreement was reached with the Suburban Collection automobiles dealership group, headquartered in Troy, Michigan. The center was renamed in 2010, the facility currently operates under the name "Suburban Collection Showplace."

The facility is currently undergoing an expansion, which when complete will increase the total square footage to 600,000 square feet. John mARTinez (professional artist) speaking on pumpkin carving:

"I love to speak to people about art, but a lot of the time people are not confident enough to talk about it back, let alone, try it. That is where pumpkins come into the picture. At some point in our lives, I believe that many people have had the opportunity to carve into a pumpkin. Even if it were only a jack-o-lantern with triangle eyes and a toothless smile, many of us are familiar with the sensation of cutting into a pumpkin to create something scary or funny. We will be able to reach a larger audience and promote water resources on a larger scale to help people understand its value while connecting water's impact on agriculture," said Commissioner Jim Nash.

"Bringing agriculture and water together is a natural fit for us. This is a historic effort and is the first time that we have had such an endeavor. Water and water resource literacy is very important to our state. You cannot have agriculture without water; it goes hand-in-hand. I am excited about this year's collaboration with the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner's Office and Commissioner Jim Nash," said Steve Masters, executive director of the Michigan State Fair.

On Thursday, August 30, the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner's Office (WRC) will promote water infrastructure literacy in recognition of WRC Day at the fair, which will consist of the following:

 WRC will show an informative educational video focusing on water infrastructure, Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG), ragging caused by flushable wipes and other important issues. Presenting a visually, compelling and informative video that will be featured on three television screens. The information shared will highlight WRC's Fair Day's theme: "What You Need to Know About Our Water Resources."

- Commissioner Jim Nash and members of WRC's staff volunteer ambassadors will share information and answer questions.
- The very popular Dirt Doctors educational team will make their debut at the Michigan State Fair. They will perform a series of demonstrations teaching children about the greatest pollution threats to our waterways and natural resources. They will also highlight the water cycle and select one lucky young person from the audience to be a dirt doctor during each presentation. At 4:30 p.m., the Dirt Doctors will be featured on the Michigan State Fair's Demonstration Stage. The Dirt Doctors will only be performing on August 30 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- The Annual Kids' Clean Water Calendar Contest will be promoted, and 4th and 5th grade students will be encouraged to participate in the 2019 contest. Sponsored by Pure Oakland Water (POW), which is an ongoing educational outreach organization that is dedicated to protecting Oakland County and regional water resources through public education and community outreach; the calendar contest continues to be a popular educational initiative for school age children. Pure Oakland Water collaborates with the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner's Office to promote this educational effort each year.
- Promote the upcoming and ongoing Infrastructure 101 "What You Need to Know Below & Beyond" Library Literacy Discussions that are held throughout Oakland County. The next discussions are scheduled for September 19 in Highland Township; September 20 in Novi and September 23 in Royal Oak and will be held in each of these communities' public libraries.
- Provide a wealth of literature ranging from PFAS, lead and copper, waterfront, lakes, and groundwater to information relating to the Water Residential Assistance Program (WRAP) and career opportunities. This information will be provided courtesy of the Michigan Ground Water Association, the Wayne Metropolitan Community Action Agency, the Great Lakes Water Authority, Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner's Office along with many other agencies and organizations.
- To promote conservation literacy and bring awareness to the importance of being good stewards of water resources and the impact of recyclable bottles, WRC will have a quench cart courtesy of the Michigan Groundwater Association and Wayne Metropolitan Community Action Agency. The cart will be available only on August 30.

These are only a few of the many highlights that will be taking place during WRC's Day at the fair on August 30. Following the official day, the Oakland County Water Resources Office will have a presence from Thursday, August 30 to Monday, September 3, which will end on Labor Day.
