FEES:

Exhibitor: \$15.00 (required) admits one person. Extra passes are available for \$15.00. Includes admission to fair.

Parking: \$15.00 for weekend (Pass allows access behind the building after Thursday, August 29.)

Per Head \$15.00 (open classes only)

YOUTH pays exhibitor fee \$15.00 only.

If a youth enters in the open classes – open fee and per head fee apply.

BREED REGISTRATION

An animal is eligible to enter and compete at the Michigan State Fair LLC in only one breed Classification regardless if the animal is registered in more than one breed association or registry.

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SHOW – OPEN & YOUTH

***** Please check and follow General Agriculture & Livestock Rules *****

1. Exhibitor form, Animal Entry form and Current W-9 (or Canadian) must be filled out and returned. **Entries must include fees.**
2. **OWNER IS THE EXHIBITOR.**
3. The beef show will be for breeding cattle only and will be open to adult and youth exhibitors.
4. Youth Exhibitors that will be competing in the junior division of the show must show their own animal unless species chairpersons grant special permission. In the event that a substitute showperson is approved, the substitute showperson must be a registered junior exhibitor in this show. Bulls must be born on September 1, 2023, or after, in order for youth to exhibit bulls. Proper identification of junior exhibitor may be required, at the discretion of the show committee.
5. **Each Exhibitor or Family Farm is limited to eight (8) head per breed in the Open Show. Each Youth Exhibitor is limited to four (4) head per breed in the Youth Show. Youth Show is open to Michigan youth.**
6. **Youth may not enter an animal in the same class for in-person and 4-H virtual show. (Example: if a youth enters an Angus Early Spring Heifer Calf in the in-person show, they may not enter an Angus Early Spring Heifer Calf in the 4-H Virtual Show).**
7. All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374 by August 1, 2024. There is a mandatory \$5.00 processing fee for all mail in entries. **LATE ENTRIES: Entries received between August 2, 2024, and August 7, 2024, will incur a \$50.00 Late Entry Fee.**
8. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the **“Michigan State Fair LLC”** or complete valid credit card information and signature.
9. **CAMPING.** Camping **MUST BE** registered for **SEPARATELY**. Please use this link to apply: <https://suburbancollectionshowplace.wufoo.com/forms/recreational-vehicle-camping-permit-application/>
10. In addition, all other breeds are welcome to participate in the **All Other Registered Breeds (AOR)** division. For heifers and bulls that have a registration certificate but do not satisfy the criteria listed below, those cattle will show in the **AOR** division. **AOR Purebred (Charolais, Limosin, Maine-Anjou (high percentage), etc.). AOR Percentage (Simmental less than 50%, Maintainer, Chiania, etc.).**
11. There will be classes in the open show for bulls born on or after January 1, 2022, classes in the junior show for bulls born on or after September 1, 2023, heifers born on or after September 1, 2022, and cow/calf pairs. In the cow/calf classes, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and must have been born on or after September 1, 2023. Cow/calf pairs will count as one entry fee unless the calf will also be shown in a class as an individual. In this case, two entry fees must be submitted.
12. The name listed on the entry form as exhibitor must also be listed on the animal's registration certificate as “owner”.
13. Ownership Deadlines: Beef cattle exhibitor entries must be transferred in National Association by the exhibitor by **August 1** of current year, with printed registration paper by check in.
14. All junior, exhibitor owned cattle must be registered solely in the name of the youth exhibitor.
15. An exhibitor may substitute an animal within the same class as entered at no charge. The exhibitor will be charged a fee of \$5.00 to substitute an animal into a different class, or breed.
16. An exhibitor may not receive more than one award in group classes. An exhibitor may show a maximum of two head per individual class. Only first place winners are eligible for Champion prizes; Second place animals may compete for Reserve Championships.
17. Pair of heifers is two (2) heifers of the same breed, any age (no cows), owned by one exhibitor or family.
18. Pair of bulls is two (2) bulls of the same breed, any age, owned by one exhibitor or family.
19. **The floor in the livestock area is polished concrete. Bark will be provided by Michigan State Fair. Hay, shavings and straw are available from a feed source. Michigan State Fair provides bark for pre-bedding stalls before arrival.**
20. Grooming Regulations: Use of false tail heads or adding of hair or hemp is prohibited. No coloring (including powders, adhesives and spray paints). Use of powders is prohibited. No forced administration of fluids by pumping, drenching or any other method for any reason will be allowed. **Violation of any of these rules will result in the disqualification of the entry and/or exhibitor, and the exhibitor and/or their representatives, including family members, fitters, managers, etc., may be banned from future shows.**

21. Each breed association will receive a 10' x 10' booth space for breed promotional material, at no charge, if space available. **Please contact Superintendent by August 5, 2024.**
22. **Original registration papers** must be presented at check-in time for all cattle that will be shown in a breed division. Registration applications will not be accepted. Registration papers may be electronically checked for accuracy.
23. All fitting must be done in or next to the barn. No fitting in trailers or tie out area.
24. Fans and other cooling devices will not be allowed in the aisles. Butt fans (suspended or on carts) will not be allowed. A maximum of one (1) fan per three head of cattle, will be permitted.
25. All bulls more than one year of age must be secured with a nose ring or nose lead secured to the satisfaction of the superintendent/s, or the bull will not be allowed to stay on the grounds. All cattle must be secured by neck ties and halters.
26. No tie out gates will be provided, but cattle may be tied to trailers or pens set up at trailer in designated areas. **Tie out will start at 7:00 pm. All cattle will be in stall by 9:00 am.** If tie outs are used, all bedding **MUST** be cleaned up and moved to the manure bunker before 11:00 am Monday morning. **Trailers are not to be parked in tie-outs without the beef superintendent or designee there to approve the parking.**
27. No grooming chutes allowed in aisles. Chute areas must be kept clean.
28. **DOG NOTICE (Exhibitors Only):**
 - **NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS/BUILDINGS/TENTS, EXCEPT LEADER DOGS. Dogs are allowed in the camping area ONLY and must be kept on a leash at all times.**
29. Premier Michigan Breeder – The breeder winning the most points, not to exceed six animals in the open single classes exhibited by himself shall be designated the Premier Breeder. The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

31. The Michigan Shorthorn Association is designating this show as: **Bill Hale Memorial Junior Shorthorn Show and Bill Hale Memorial Shorthorn Show.**
32. After entries close, if any AOR Breed has 10 or more head, that breed will be given its own Show. **If any breed has less then 5 entries the show reserves the right to move them to AOR.**
33. Commercial heifers are not eligible for premier breeder nor bred and owned.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

- 1. Where a herd is registered in the name of different members of a family or a family farm, and the herd is one unit, all entries are eligible for bred and owned, group classes and Premier Exhibitor.
- 2. For cattle to be considered “Bred and Owned”, the listed breeder on the registration must be the exhibitor or another member of the family unit, or the family farm.
- 3. For group classes the animals must be of the same breed.
- 4. If an animal does not meet the breed requirements, they can be shown in the commercial division.

NEW FOR 2024 – HERDSMAN AWARD

The Michigan State Fair will recognize an outstanding herdsman and caretaker of their beef exhibit. The superintendents, or a committee designated by the superintendents, will determine the winner. Recipient will be recognized during the selection of the Supreme of Supremes competition, with a cash award. The following criteria will be used to determine the winner.

- Neatness and attractiveness of stall area, bedding, signage, etc.
- Appearance of the animals
- Cleanliness of the aisle area
- Exhibitor’s behavior while at the State Fair
- Friendliness and courtesy toward other exhibitors and the general public.
